candidate for Upper Hunter Chris Parker and Greens MLC Cate Faehrmann.

BVPA interim vice-president Stuart Andrews said the support was heartening.

"It's the 21st Century and everyone knows the way things should be done - and that's having one complete view of ground and surface water and managing it as one resource,' he said.

"It's time to stop flying half blind and to start doing things properly."
